

Very clever book and good illustrations (kind of based on The Three Little Pigs). Child (3 years old) who received it as a gift simply loved it. My school librarian also read to classes of 1st and 2nd graders. It was one of their favorite books.

I'm an elementary librarian and I read this "fractured fairy tale" to my kindergartners and 1st graders.

Now I can't keep the book on the shelf. The kids are still asking for it 6 months later! That's the sign of an entertaining and fun book. Highly recommended.

I stumbled on this book while visiting family in Texas. I thought it was a blast to read it out loud to my 4year old son. Even though it is a retelling of a classic, reading it with a deep Texas drawl right after visiting the family is awesome to my son! I really hope this stays with him as fun memories of Texas.

This is a cute book and it fun to read it to little children when you are planning on reading a traditional version of the three little pigs. It is always interesting to see the comparisons that the children will make. I like the setting and some of the 'swamp information' that you will get from this book. I think it is just a good story for little people and they should enjoy it. I know that I enjoyed reading it and I am not so little any more.

This is a neat Southern version of the Three Little Bears. Our girls fell in love with this book when we borrowed it from our local library. Even though it has been a few months, they still talk about it. I believe I will get us a personal copy so we can always have it on hand!
