

One is Wolves for kids and the other is this one National Geographic Wolves. They like this one better because the Photo's are better and there was more too it. If your child is 5-8, then this is the intended age of this short book. Some of the reviewers here said it was for too little of kids and their older children didn't like it. The description clearly says this is for ages 5-8, so if you're buying it for a ten or twelve year old, be prepared for a bored and disinterested kid.Great pictures and not too much highly detailed information, our daughter has read it probably 200 times, no exaggeration.
