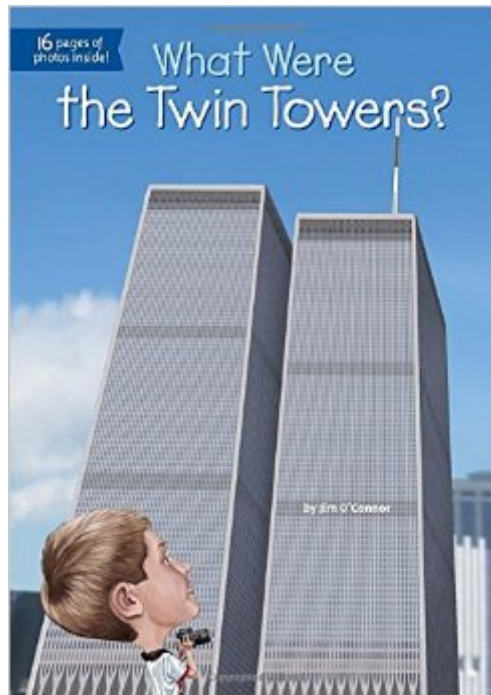

My son loved this book. The only drawback is that it does not qualify for AR points; however, he learned a lot about 9/11 and that was the purpose. I like the way the tragedy and vicious attack was told in a way he could understand. (He's almost 11.) It also opened up for some questions he asked me and started a conversation.

My daughter, who is now an adult, visited the Twin Towers a number of times as a child, and had a very hard time with what happened in 2001. She was about 10 then and at her age it was an information over load. I think it is important for children today to know what the Twin Towers were

and why they are an important piece of history, but the information has to be presented properly. The author of this book has done an awesome job of presenting the history of the towers, from dream to reality, along with the history of what happened to them in 2001. It is informative, but not overly graphic or sensationalized. And, he even includes information on the construction of the towers and how the builders overcame problems during construction. This is an excellent book that should be in every school library in the country and in the home library of any child that is curious about the towers and what happened to them on 9/11.
