Based upon the reviews of the authors other books, I decided to check this book out from the library instead of buying it. I thought it would be appropriate for an almost three year old. The age range listed is 2-5 years old. However, this book is way too hard. My son is very bright, yet he had a very difficult time finding the pairs, and I don't blame him. I added a picture showing the bear page. I think looking at it you can see just how hard it would be for even a smart three year old to find the pair. He can find ones with the same scarf and then doesn't understand why those are not considered the pair. I would consider a more appropriate age range to be 5-8 maybe?

This book is awesome! My 4 and 5 year olds love hidden pictures, I-spy books, that kinda thing. This book is actually really challenging - they found "the pair" a few times before I did. Cute, short rhymes to go with each page. My 4 year old only likes to do a few pages at a time, whereas the 5
